Have you just downloaded *forScore*? YAY!

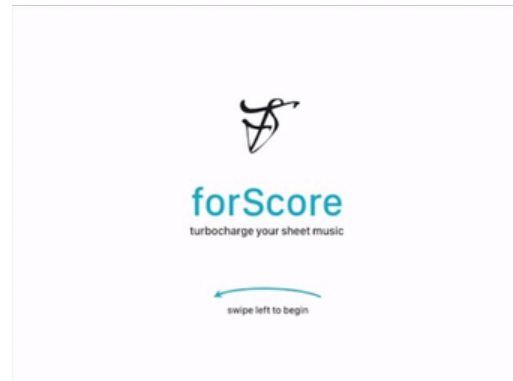
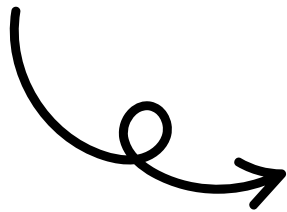
This little guide is for anyone new to *forScore* or anyone who might be finding it tricky! I promise once you are used to it, it's such a useful addition to choir life.

If you haven't downloaded *forScore* yet, you are looking for this icon on your relevant app store:



Once downloaded, it's going to become your new favourite app!

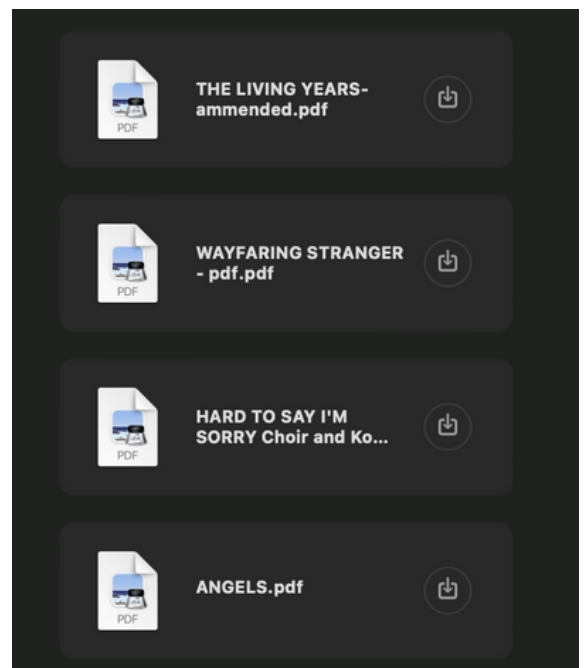
Open *forScore* and you will be greeted with the screen as shown here:



forScore will not work without any music, below is a guide to download from Karen's weekly email:

Open Karen's weekly email and scroll to the bottom:

Tap on the music you want to put into *forScore*.

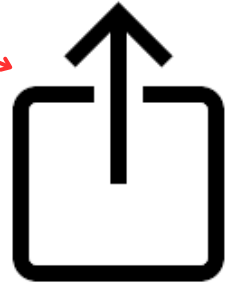

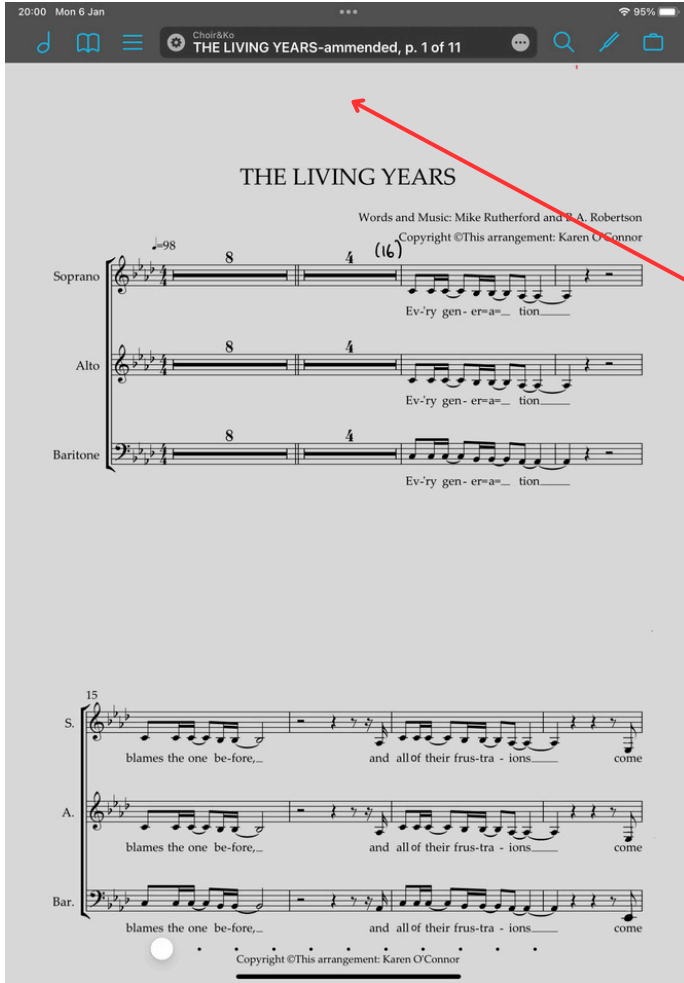
Your music will appear like this, at the top of the screen it will either come up with an option to 'Open in forScore' or an icon on the right as seen here:

That's it! It is now saved automatically in *forScore*. You can now begin adding it to set lists for gigs - A guide to set this up is on the next page.

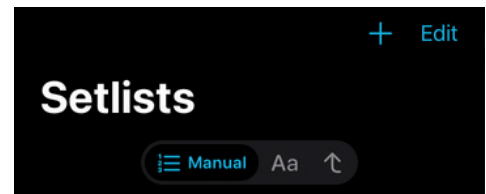
forScore Guide - Making a set list



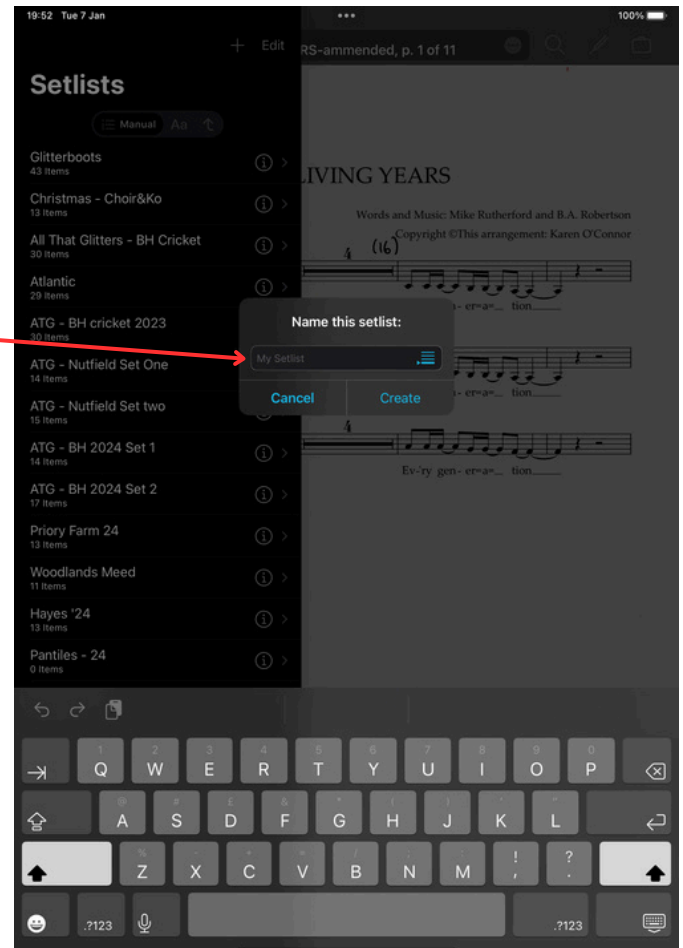
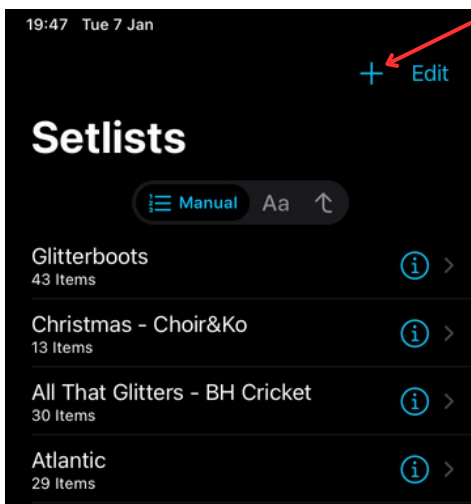
Making a set list is simple once you have the know-how!

To make a set list, tap the screen towards the top middle and a grey bar will appear at the top:

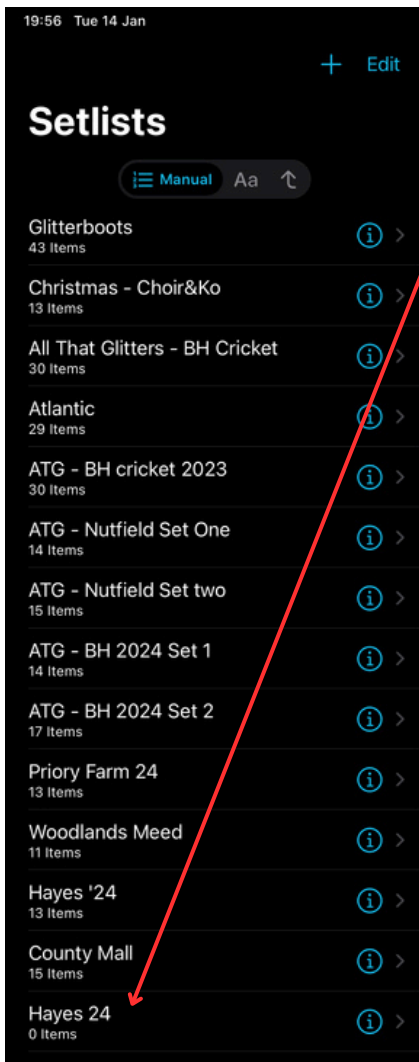
On the left hand side, tap the three horizontal lines. The sidebar for 'set lists' will come up on the left hand side.



Tap the + button to create a new set list and name it (I normally do this by the name of the gig i.e. Hayes 2024).

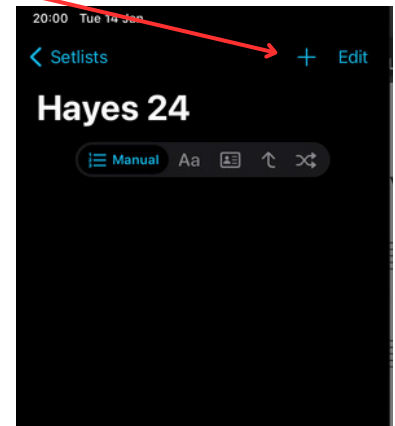


forScore Guide - Making a set list



The set list will appear on the left hand side, if you have lots of set lists (like me!) it will normally appear at the bottom.

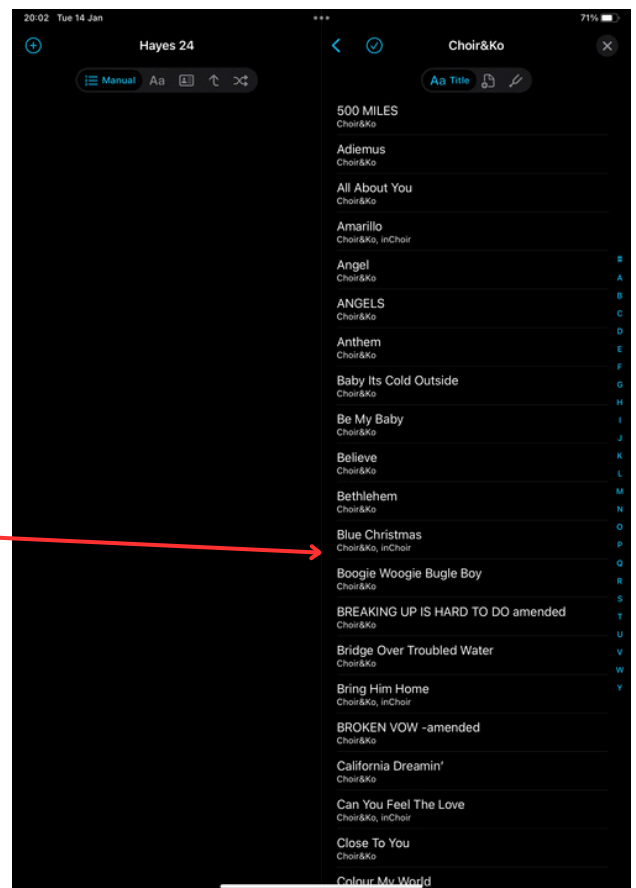
Tap the set list you want to add music to and tap the add button at the top.



All music you have imported into forScore will be on the right hand side of the screen. Manually, go through the set list and tap the songs you need (in the correct order).

Once finished, press the 'x' in the top right corner and you're done!

Once a performance is finished, to get back to your full list of music, tap the top-middle of the screen the musical note on the very left of the screen.
